YOUTH WORK PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

Where can you apply for a work permit?

Youth needing a work permit should go to:

Your local High School such as

Waubonsie Valley High School will issue work permits Monday – Friday 8am-11am and 1-2 pm.

- Neuqua Valley High School (blue campus) will issue work permits Monday – Friday 7am-3pm.
- Metea Valley High School will issue work permits Monday – Friday 7am-3pm

Who can apply for a work permit?

WORK PERMITS must be obtained by all minors under 16 years of age before beginning work.

What do you need to bring when applying for a work permit?

Youth should bring the following items when applying for a work permit:

- Parent
- Valid ID
- Letter of Intent to Hire: This is a letter from the employer who has hired the youth. It must be on business letterhead and include the contact information (address and phone number) of the employer/business. The hours and days per week the youth will work must be listed, as well as the exact nature of the occupation.
- Verification of Age (only one of the following):
 - Birth Certificate
 - Passport
- A physical, dated within one year of the date the minor is applying
- **Your local HIGH SCHOOL will also have information/forms needed to obtain a work permit**

Special Rules for 13 year old soccer referee and linesmen:



House Bill 5996 makes a change to the Child Labor Law that allows a not-for-profit youth club, park district, municipal park or recreation department to hire 13 year olds to officiate youth athletic events providing the following criteria are met:

- A parent or guardian of the officiating minor must be present while the minor is officiating.
- The employer must obtain an employment certificate for the minor from the local high school or school district.
- The minor is limited to 3 hours of work per day on school days and 4 hours of work on non-school days.
- The minor may not officiate more than 10 hours per week and may not work past 9PM.
- The officiating minor must be at least 3 years older than the youths participating in the sporting event or someone at least 16 years of age must be officiating the same event.
