



COVID-19 GUIDELINES - 2021

The Kachina Classic Invitational is pleased to host our 34th annual soccer tournament in these unprecedented times. While our desire is for our youth to play soccer, we need to consider the health and safety of coaches, players, referees, and spectators, as well as comply with AYSO, CDC recommended guidelines and government ordinance. All Guidelines are subject to change at any time and teams should be notified should that occur.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation. Therefore, all teams must adhere to the following guidelines:

- All spectators must wear a mask and be 6' socially distanced from members of a different household.
- All players or spectators are advised to stay home if fever or positive COVID-19 symptoms are currently present in their household or pending results of a Covid test.
- Coaches must wear a mask at all times.
- Players must wear a mask to and from the field and when not playing.
- No pre/post game handshakes or high-fives.
- Teams must bring their own equipment, benches, and canopies.
- Teams agree to COVID-19 reporting should exposure occur.
- There will be no coin toss at the beginning of the match. The visiting team will automatically be given the ball at the start of play and the home team will get to select which goal they wish to defend. The home team will start the second half.
- Referees will beckon the coach onto the field to address player injuries.
- All teams must immediately exit the field upon completion of the match.
- Home team will provide at least 3 game balls for the match. Game balls should be sanitized before and after each match.
- Parents and families are discouraged from remaining at the park before or after their game is played.
- All pre-match check-ins will take place on the field with the referee. All players should come prepared with cleats, mask, and shin guards on. Player passes will be left at the Check In Table until the completion of the game.
- All coaches and team administrators will be responsible for the monitoring of their spectator's behavior. Spectators shall not use abusive language towards officials, tournament staff, guest, or players. To ensure all those associated with their team are tournament Covid compliant. Those who refuse to Covid compliant may be asked to leave the facility.
- The coach has the responsibility for the conduct of both players and fans on their sideline. Your team is responsible for making sure that its sideline is clean after each game. No alcoholic beverages, smoking or simulated smoking (vaping) will be allowed on or near the tournament fields.
- Spectators will sit on the same sideline as their teams. Home sits on the north or east touchline, visitors sit on south or west touchline.
