

AYSO Region 214 Championship Rules of Play

During playoff games, standard regional rules, as found under AYSO Region 214 Rules of Play, will apply.

If the game ends in a tie at the end of regulation time, overtime play will begin, in order to break the tie:

1. Two Overtime Periods, and if still tied
2. Kicks from the Penalty Mark

Two Overtime Periods

Two overtime periods will be played in full (no golden goals or sudden death). The amount of overtime varies by division as specified by the chart below:

Division	Amount in Each of Two Overtime Periods
U10	5 minutes
U12	5 minutes
U14	7 minutes

The procedure will occur in the following manner:

1. The referee will request that the team captains and coaches come to the center circle to explain the overtime procedures.
2. The referee will conduct a coin toss, similar to the start of the game.
3. The team correctly calling the toss will choose which goal to attack. The other team will kick-off.
4. At the end of the first overtime period, the teams will change sides and the game will be restarted with a kick-off by the team that did not kick off for the first overtime period.
5. A short break, of no more than three minutes, is permitted between the two overtime periods.

Of special note during Overtime Periods

- The three quarter playing rule does not apply as it has already been satisfied during the regulation length game.
- The teams are not required to make any substitutions during the overtime periods.
- If a team wants to make any substitutions, such substitutions may only be made before the start of each overtime period or to replace an injured player.
- Free substitution is not permitted.
- Time will not be extended or added for either overtime period, except for the taking and completion of a penalty kick, or added time, at the referee's discretion, due to a serious injury or event resulting in stoppage of play for greater than one minute.
- If a player has been sent-off during regulation time, that sanction will continue through the overtime periods and the team will be required to play with only the number of players permitted after the send-off(s).

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If the score is still tied after completion of both overtime periods, the winner shall be determined by Kicks from the Penalty Mark.

Kicks from the Penalty Mark

The Laws specify the procedures to be followed in the event a game must be determined by Kicks from the Penalty Mark. All of those procedures shall be followed with two exceptions:

1. All substitutes shall be permitted to join the players on their team in the center circle, but the referee must note that such players are substitutes and will not be permitted to participate in the kicks.
2. A maximum of two (2) coaches from the team may join the team in the center circle.

Referees must read and be familiar with procedures to determine the winner of a match through Kick from the Penalty Mark:
