



NYAA Parent Code of Conduct Agreement

I hereby agree to live up to my responsibilities at Norcross Youth Athletic Association and adhere to the following code of conduct:

- Parents are expected to assist Coaches and Team Moms with the various responsibilities required during the season. This includes up to 10 required hours of volunteering for ticket gates and concession stands. Assistance is also needed for chain crew and game announcer. **It is the parent(s) responsibility to find a replacement (16yrs or older) in the event of a scheduling or health conflict.** Failure to work for the scheduled volunteer assignment(s) will result in a fee of **\$50.00 (per occurrence)**. The player/cheerleader will be suspended from all NYAA and GFL events, games and/or practices until the fee is paid.
- Parents, siblings, grandparents, other family members and guests must adhere to the Code of Conduct as set forth by the GFL. A violation of the Code of Conduct will result in fines and/or suspension from any GFL sanctioned activity.
- Use of ANY tobacco products is not allowed in designated football and cheerleading practice/game areas or any Gwinnett County parks. Violations will result in fines of \$100 per incident.
- Any participant who is ejected from a game on two or more occasions during one season is subject to suspension or ejection from the GFL.
- Use of alcohol during practice and/or games will NOT be tolerated.
- Profanity or any threatening, abusive language towards the coaches, parents, teammates, GFL or NYAA officials will NOT be tolerated. Anyone found violating this rule will be asked to leave the confines of the playing area. **ANY SPECTATOR WHO IS ASKED TO LEAVE THE CONFINES OF THE PLAYING FIELD AREA AND THEN REFUSES WILL BE ESCORTED OUT OF THE PARK BY GWINNETT COUNTY AUTHORITIES ON THE PREMISES.** Incidents of this kind will be documented and if upon approval of the



NYAA Board of Directors, the child(ren) of the parent involved can be dismissed from the NYAA and no refund will be given. Future application of this child into the Association would be upon approval of the NYAA Board of Directors. The decision of the NYAA Board of Directors is final. No refunds will be given to any child/parent dismissed from the association for behavioral issues.

- The use of noisemakers such as air horns, whistles, or sirens are not allowed at games. Violations may result in a fine to the association. Approved noisemakers are small 20 ounce soda bottles with materials in it to make noise, cow bells, and thunder sticks.
- PARENTS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE PRACTICE OR GAME FIELDS. CERTIFIED COACHING STAFF ONLY.**
- PARENTS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO LEAVE THEIR CHILD(REN) UNATTENDED (WITHOUT ADULT SUPERVISION) DURING PRACTICE OR GAMES.**
- Any participant who is ejected by a game official for violation of GFL rules or the GFL Code of Conduct must leave the confines of the arena. Failure to do so will result in fines and/or suspension or ejection from the GFL as well as additional disciplinary action from the NYAA, including but not limited to suspension from all practices and/or future games.
- Parents must abide by the Gwinnett County Parks and Recreation Rules. **THIS INCLUDES PARKING IN DESIGNATED PARKING SPACES ONLY**
