 - Schedule to take or retake the SAT and ACT

- ★ Work on improving your game on your time
 - Ball work - Footskills, 1st touch, Ball Control, Striking, etc.
 - Strength & Fitness
 - Speed, Agility & Quickness
- ★ Create and continue to build relationships with the coaching staff of each school you are in contact with
- ★ Participate in ODP
 - Having ODP on your Player Profile can be helpful to show college coaches your level of play and commitment
- ★ Attend College ID Camps
 - Attend College ID Camps that have many different schools in attendance
 - Attend College ID Camps at your top 5 schools to help solidify your relationship with a specific program.
- ★ Continue adding to your highlight video



❖ JUNE - JULY

- Update or create your Player Profile and send it to schools you are interested in
 - 15 schools is the goal
- Attend College ID Camps
 - Attend camps that have multiple colleges attending the camp
 - Attend a camp of a school that is at the top of your list to help solidify the relationship with the coaching staff
- Create or update your highlight video
 - Reach out to schools you are communicating with with your updated highlight video

❖ AUGUST

- Start the school year off by staying ahead on your assignments

- Register in the NAIA Eligibility Center (<https://play.mynaia.org/>)
- Meet with your guidance counselor and review your academic curriculum.
 - Confirm you are meeting NCAA core course requirements
 - Get your GPA based on these classes.
- Update your player profile and communicate the update to the schools on your list
- **BOYS AND GIRLS** communicate your College Showcase Event schedule to the schools you are in contact with
- **BOYS** communicate your game schedule with details to the schools you are interested in
- **GIRLS** communicate your high school game schedule to local schools you are interested in



❖ SEPTEMBER - OCTOBER

- Make an “unofficial” visit to a college or university on your list
- Attend college soccer games
 - See what it’s like at the next level
- Continue to communicate with schools on your list
- Update your player profile and communicate the update to the schools on your list
- Add to your highlight video and communicate the update to the schools on your list

❖ NOVEMBER - DECEMBER

- Meet with your guidance counselor to discuss your academic curriculum for Spring
- **BOYS AND GIRLS** communicate the game details to the schools on your list for the College Showcase Events you are attending
- Make an “unofficial” visit to a college or university on your list
- Attend college soccer games
 - See what it’s like at the next level
- Continue to communicate with schools on your list
- Update your player profile and communicate the update to the schools on your list
- Add to your highlight video and communicate the update to the schools on your list
- Attend a College ID Camp with multiple schools attending
- Attend a College ID Camp for a school at the top of your list
- Take 2-3 schools off of your list
 - Based on your interest in the school
 - Based on the amount of communication with the school



❖ JANUARY - FEBRUARY

- **BOYS** send your game details for the District, Regional, or State tournament games to the schools you are communicating with
- Narrow your school list down to your Top 10 by the end of May
 - Your feelings about a school or program
 - The amount of communication you have with the school
- Schedule to attend ID Camps of your top school choices.
 - Choose a school or schools you need to solidify a relationship with
- Make a list of colleges you plan to use your official visits on.
