Little League Rules	Ages 7, 8 (Regardless of what SP division they played)  Not recognized as “All Stars” by Little League; this is Special Games Tournament. An 8 yo who played Little Majors for regular season may be eligible for both Machine Pitch “All Stars” team and the Little Majors/Junior Majors All Stars team.	Ages 8, 9, 10 (8 yo must have played minimum required games in SPLL Little Majors division)  <i>Specific minimum regular season game play required for players to be eligible</i>	Ages 10, 11, 12 (10 yo must have played minimum required games in SPLL  <i>Specific minimum regular season game play required for players to be eligible</i> Majors division)	11, 12, 13 (13 yo may be eligible for participation in both Intermediate & Juniors divisions All Star play. Note: Little League International refers to the divisions below Majors/Little League as “Minors” (8-11 yo). This allows SPLL Minors (Machine Pitch) players to substitute for SPLL Little Majors teams without penalty for regular season play.

T-Ball division does not allow for does not participate in “All Star” or postseason play.
