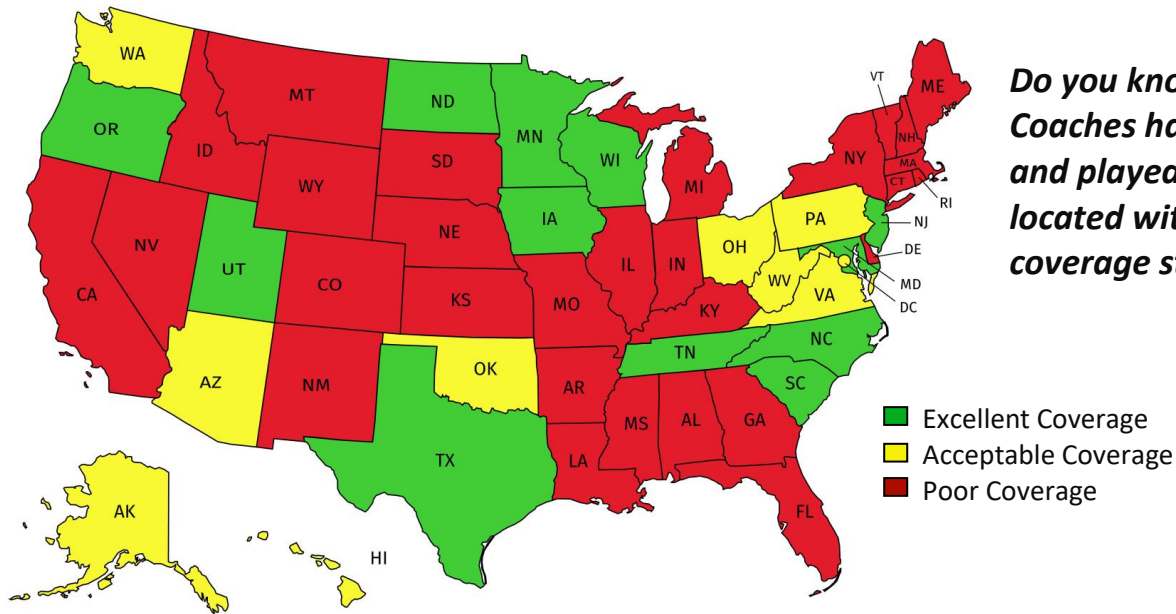


Do you *REALLY* know what's in your Coaches Background Checks?

It is critical to layer multiple searches to achieve a **QUALITY** Background Check

What Are You Checking?



Do you know where your Coaches have lived, worked and played? Is your league located within a "POOR" coverage state?

Know the Facts

The Nationwide (a.k.a. National Criminal, NatCrim) is a common national database search. It is a valuable search tool and a good place to start to check criminal records, but still has limitations. It should never be used as a standalone source. For a quality background check, at a minimum, along with the Nationwide, you should also be checking the Department of Justice National Sex Offender Registry (NSOPW), validating records at the primary source – the county or state courthouse and monthly updating to help identify new crimes. Here are some facts:

- **29** states in the Nationwide database have poor coverage; **35%** of jurisdictions DO NOT submit records; Some records are stale, and updated infrequently.
- Low hit rates of only **1-2%**. Why does this matter? Because **1 in 4 adults** has an arrest or conviction record. A lower hit rate means you are most likely not checking complete, accurate sources which means you're less likely to catch the bad guys and gals.
- Validation of hits is required to be compliant. FCRA non-compliance means you're at a higher risk and vulnerable to lawsuits. Double check to ensure your national check is validated against the primary source.
