### **TOURNAMENT NOTES (2014)**

-Goodlettsville, Tennessee continues to build upon their tournament record for both consecutive appearances and overall appearances as they came to Greenville for the fourth time in the last four years. Joey Hale, manager of the 2012 United States Championship team from Goodlettsville, made his third appearance in Greenville as a manager. Hale is one of two managers (Randy Morris of Northern Little League in Columbus, Georgia is the other.) to have managed in the TOSC and in the Little League World Series.

-Nicolas Demasi of Irmo, South Carolina and Caleb Powell of Goodlettsville, Tennessee hit the only two triples in this year's TOSC. The rigid wood fence located 200 feet from home plate that often times creates friendly bounces for outfielders has likely contributed to the fact that there have only been 5 triples (an average of 1 per year) in TOSC history.

-TOSC batters swatted 62 extra base hits in 2014. This is a 15 extra base hit increase (or 1 per game) over the 47 that were hit in 2013.

-Home runs, which for the last 3 years have been at an average of 16 per tournament, jumped to a record (eclipsing the record of 32 hit in 2010) total of 34 during this year's TOSC. Keystone LL (Odessa, FL) set the team tournament record by clubbing 11 roundtrippers. 5 of those bombs were hit by Keaton Howard as he was able to tie the individual home run record set by Brooks Carlson of Westside LL (Mobile, AL) in 2010. Had it not been for Keystone's proficiency at hitting the long ball Wilson City's (Wilson, NC) total of 8 homers would have tied the old tournament record. The 19 homers hit by the top two squads in this year's TOSC represent just over half of the home runs hit in the tournament.

-Free passes were issued 97 times to TOSC batsmen. That number represents a decrease in 7 walks from 2013. 20 times TOSC batters “took one for the team”. This is a decrease in 5 plunked batters from 2013. It is interesting to note that the Smyrna (GA) youngsters absorbed pain from TOSC pitchers on 8 occasions meaning that 40% of the hit batters were Georgia players (They were really nice kids☺ so we don’t know why this was the case.)

-Strikeouts were way down in the 2014 TOSC. 158 times TOSC players “grabbed some bench”. This number is quite a decrease from the 194 whiffs that were seen in the 2013 TOSC. Other than 2013 the tournament strikeout totals have been remarkably consistent. There were 164 in the tournament’s inaugural year of 2010 while there were 153 in 2011, and 152 in 2012.

-In 2013 there were no offensive records broken but that was a different story in 2014. Chase Waddell of Wilson City (Wilson, NC) broke the tournament batting average record as he batted .786 (11-14). He broke Kyle Novak of Great Falls LL (VA) record of .714 (10-14). Keaton Howard of Keystone LL (Odessa, FL) tied the tournament home run record with a total of 5. Keaton matched the record of Westside LL’s Brooks Carlson (Mobile, AL) who smacked 5 home runs in 2010. Keystone LL also broke the team home run record as they hit a total of 11 round trippers. Keystone broke the previous record of 8 set in 2010 by Maitland (FL) Little League.

-The cumulative batting average of all players in the TOSC was .320 this year. This is a huge 42 point increase from 2013’s mark of .278. The record for cumulative batting average is the incredible .337 that TOSC hitters hit for in 2010.

-Rain was definitely a theme for the 2014 Tournament of State Champions. The opening ceremonies were moved indoors due to heavy rains on the Friday prior to the tournament. The tournament’s first game between Alabama and Georgia was delayed for two hours on Saturday. Later on Saturday the tournament’s third game between Tennessee and Virginia was delayed for an hour and 43 minutes between the fifth and sixth innings. Sunday’s first game (originally scheduled for 10am) between Tennessee and North Carolina did not begin until 2:30 as there was a 4 hour and 30 minute delay to begin play on Sunday. The delays also allowed the participants in the TOSC to set records for late play. Saturday’s fourth game between South Carolina and West Virginia concluded at 11:15pm. This broke the previous record for late play of 11:08pm that was set by Alabama and North Carolina in 2011. The 11:15pm record only lasted for 24 hours though as South Carolina and Alabama played until 11:45pm on Sunday night in the day (and night’s) fourth game. Through all of the rain though, the tournament did conclude on Wednesday afternoon the sixth of August as it was scheduled to.

-Once again, and for the fourth time in tournament history no quarterfinal game was needed. West Springfield American LL (VA) remains the only team to have ever won a quarterfinal game as they defeated Bull City LL (Durham, NC) 7-4 in 2012. West Springfield then went on to lose an 8-6, 8 inning decision to eventual champion Plant City LL later that day in the semifinals.

### **TOURNAMENT NOTES 2013**

-Goodlettsville, Tennessee made a tournament record 3<sup>rd</sup> appearance in the TOSC. Joey Hale, fresh off of his 2012 United States Championship in Williamsport, returned to Elm Street Park for his second time as he managed the 2013 Goodlettsville 10-11 squad in addition to managing Goodlettsville's 2011 entry.

-Ian Huang of Chantilly National Little League (Virginia) and Coby Mayo of North Springs Little League (Coral Springs, Florida) hit the first triples seen in the TOSC since 2011. There have now been 3 triples hit in the tournament's first 4 years.

-There were 47 extra base hits hit in the 2013 TOSC. This number represents a decrease in 19 from the year before.

-The 16 long balls hit in the 2013 TOSC represent a decrease of 3 from 2012. The tournament record is still 32 which was established in the tournament's inaugural year of 2010.

-104 times TOSC players reached first via walks. 25 times TOSC batters "took one for the team" and reached first the hard way by being plunked by a pitch.

-As they are in Major League Baseball strikeouts are on the increase in the TOSC. 194 times TOSC hitters failed to put the ball in play and had to head back to the dugout after striking out. This is a 41 strike out increase from 2012.

-As the TOSC matures it has become more and more difficult for individuals to break offensive records. 2013 represents the first time that no player was able to break an offensive record.

-The overall batting average for all hitters in the 2013 TOSC was .278 as compared to .292 for the 2012 tournament.

-The first two females to participate in the TOSC each left their mark in a positive manner. Emily Riggs of Bridgeport, West Virginia homered during pool play but her mound work was what everybody will remember her for. While pitching effectively during her pool play efforts she will be most thought of for allowing only 1 earned run against eventual champion Florida over 5.1 innings of work in the tournament semifinal. Kailey Brown's team of Goodlettsville, Tennessee did not make it out of pool play but Kailey left her mark on the TOSC as well. In 9 at bats Kailey had 6 hits, three of which went for extra bases (2 doubles and a home run). With her .667 batting average Kailey left Greenville with the 4<sup>th</sup> best performance for a hitter (percentage wise, minimum 8 at bats) in tournament history and hopefully a lifetime of memories.

-For the first time since 2010 there was not a rain delay during the TOSC. Earlier start times to combat the potential for midday thunderstorms certainly helped eliminate the need for the field tarps during TOSC action.

-For the third time in TOSC history there was no quarterfinal game needed. In fact, 2013 saw the first team with a 1-2 mark advance to the semifinals. West Virginia, Tennessee, Virginia, and North Carolina all sported 1-2 records but West Virginia got the fourth seed based upon Little League tie breaking procedures.

-Only two of the Southeast's eight states have posted winning TOSC records in the tournament's first 4 years. Florida has a 14-4 mark while North Carolina has a 9-7 record. Tennessee has split their sixteen games while all of the other states have records below .500.

### **TOURNAMENT NOTES (2012)**

-There were 47 doubles and 19 home runs hit for a total of 66 extra base hits in the 2012 TOSC. This compares to only 41 extra base hits in 2011.

-The 2012 TOSC saw 152 players go down on strikes while 153 players "grabbed some bench" in 2011.

-There were 110 walks issued (an increase of 40 from the year before) and 22 batters reached first after being hit by a pitch.

-The cumulative batting average of tournament hitters was .292.

-TOSC players "doubled their pleasure" by swatting 47 doubles which smashed the old record of 38 doubles set in 2010.

-Colby Brabston of Columbus, Georgia (Northern LL) and Bryar Christian of Plant City, Florida each had 5 doubles in the tournament (eclipsing the old mark of 3 which had been held by six players). Brabston had his 5 doubles in 4 games while Christian's two baggers occurred over the course of 5 games. This was the only offensive record that was broken in 2012.

-Florida, with two appearances in the championship game in three years, has the highest overall winning percentage of the eight participating states. Florida teams from Maitland (2010) and Plant City (2011 & 2012) have won 9 of 13 games since the inception of the TOSC.

-The 2012 championship game was the first of our three championships not decided in the final inning. Plant City, Florida took a 4-1 win over Goodlettsville, Tennessee in a game which saw all scoring take place in the first 3 frames.

-The first in game rain delay in TOSC history was 2 hours and 48 minutes long and occurred on Monday afternoon during the Georgia vs. Alabama game. The game was scoreless at the time of the delay. The game was resumed after each team had a good meal under their belt and watched some Olympic action on the big screen TV located in the Elm Street Center. When play resumed Alabama plated a run in the top of the third to take a 1-0 lead but Georgia scored 11 times in the bottom of the third then held Alabama scoreless in their half of the fourth to take a rain soaked, 10 run rule victory. This lengthy delay was still 40 minutes short of the record long delay of 3 hours and 28 minutes before the Virginia – Tennessee game in 2011.



-2012 was the first TOSC when at least one player didn't hit at least 3 home runs. Justin Bullock of Bull City LL (Durham, NC) and Jackson Wilder of Northwood LL (Taylors, SC) paced the field with 2 homers each.

-West Springfield American LL (VA) won the first quarter final game in TOSC history by defeating Bull City LL (Durham, NC) 7-4. West Springfield American then went on to face eventual champion Plant City, Florida a few hours later in the second semi-final game of the day. There, they lost a heartbreaking 8-6 decision in a game which took 8 innings. If 5 teams win at least 2 pool games then 1 quarterfinal game is played between the 4 & 5 seeds and if 6 teams win at least 2 pool games then 2 quarterfinal games are played (3 seed plays 6 seed and 4 seed plays 5 seed). The winners of the quarterfinal games advance to play later in the same day against seeds 1 and 2. This was the first year we ever had more than 4 teams win two games.

-Randy Morris of Northern Little League (Columbus, GA) became the first of two managers to manage a team in the Little League World Series and also manage a team in our Tournament of State Champions. Coach Morris managed the 2006 Little League World Series team from Columbus that won the world championship, defeating Kawaguchi City, Japan in the championship game. Morris also managed Northern LL in the 2010 Little League World Series. Northern's 10-11 year old team fell just short of the title game of the 2012 TOSC, bowing out in the semifinals.

Just a couple of short weeks later Joey Hale of Goodlettsville, Tennessee led his squad to the 2012 Little League World Series. There, Goodlettsville won the United States Championship before succumbing to Japan in the world title game. Coach Hale managed many of the same players in Greenville during the 2011 Tournament of State Champions. Goodlettsville finished as the runner up in the 2011 TOSC, falling 6-3 to Weddington National LL of Weddington, NC in the championship game.

-Hockey Hall of Famer and former member of the Montreal Canadians and Los Angeles Kings Larry Robinson was in attendance at the 2012 Tournament of State Champions. Mr. Robinson was most gracious to those in attendance signing several autographs as he enjoyed watching his grandson Dylan participate in the tournament. Dylan's Plant City, Florida squad went on to win the TOSC with the help of a go ahead eighth inning home run in the semi finals from Dylan which helped propel Plant City to the championship game.
