

## General League Rules

### **Sportsmanship**

The definition of sportsmanship is “The conduct and attitude of participants in sports, especially when considered commendable as in fair play, courtesy, and grace in losing.” All coaches, players, parents, referees, and league officials will exhibit proper sportsmanship. Coaches are responsible for the proper conduct of their players.

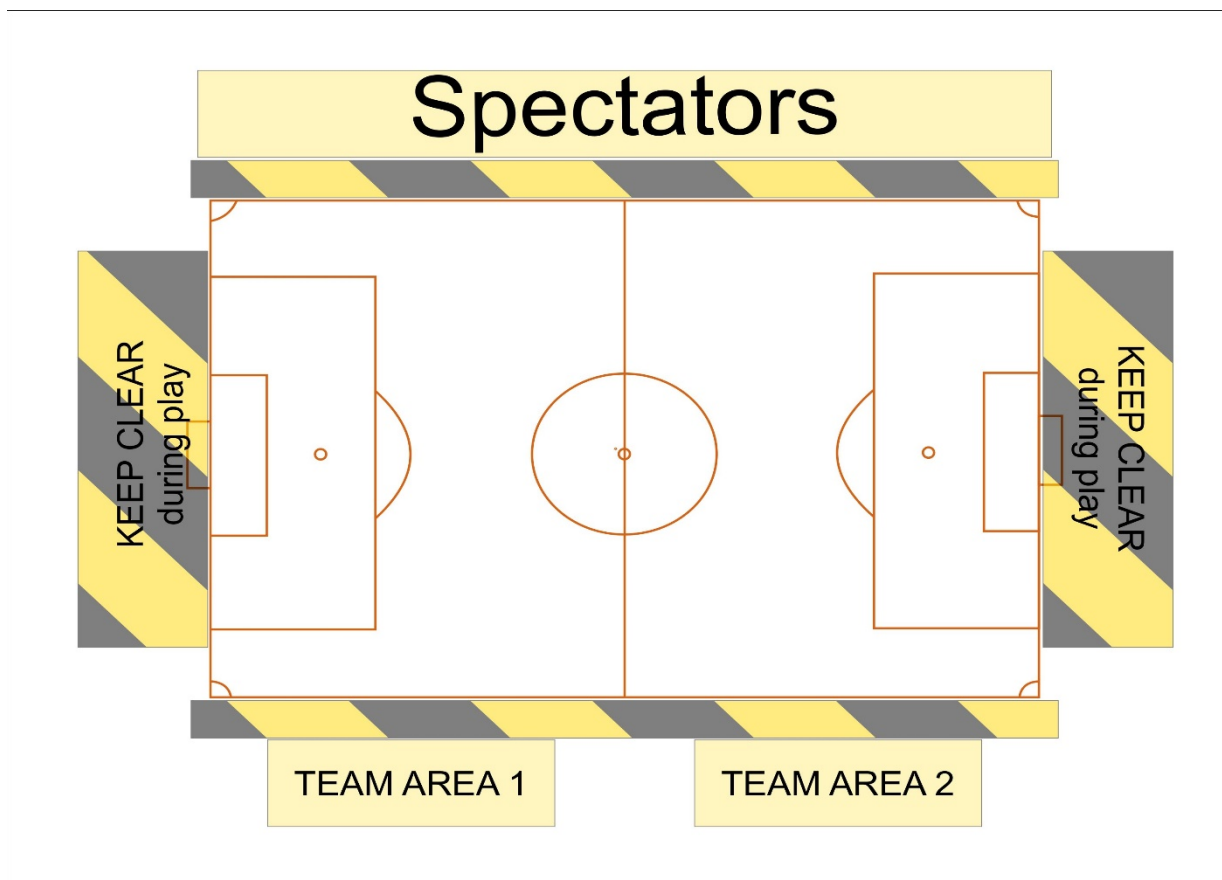
**All referee decisions are final and are not challengeable by coaches, players, spectators or parents and guardians.**

Questions of rule application should be raised (politely) AFTER the game or brought to the attention of a SYSA board member. FIFA Laws of the Game apply except as specifically modified.

Coaches, players, and parents are not permitted in the area behind the goal or past the end line. With the exception that one designated registered volunteer parent/assistant coach may serve as “goalie coach” at the U8 level only. Coaches are expected to enforce this rule with their players and family members.

Spectators are to watch the game from the designated area only, leaving approximately 3 feet space from the field for the line referees to work.

Coaches and players will remain in their designated team area during game play.

## **Safety**

SYSA Coaches, Referees and Board Members may remove a child from play if they suspect the child is injured. Any player who receives medical attention will need a medical release signed by a health care professional before returning to play.

A player who is bleeding or has blood on their uniform must leave the field and may be substituted at the coach's discretion. A uniform with blood on it must be changed. After the bleeding is stopped and the wound is covered, the player may return to the game when beckoned onto the field by the referee.

A player who demonstrates signs of concussion as a result of an observed or suspected blow to the head or body must leave the field and may not return to play in that match. Referees will include in their match report information about any player required to leave the field because of a suspected concussion. A player who has been removed from a game because of a suspected concussion is ineligible to play until SYSA has received a copy of a medical release signed by a health care professional that authorizes an unrestricted return to play.

Coaches should be aware that SB 721, enrolled as 2013 Oregon Laws Chapter 489, and codified as ORS 417.875, became effective January 1, 2014 and applies to all competitions sanctioned by OYSA. If a player exhibits signs of concussion following an observed or suspected blow to the head or body, a coach is prohibited from allowing that player to participate in any competition, including practice, until the player has been cleared to return to play by a health care professional.

## **Player Equipment**

All players on the field must wear matching uniforms (except goalkeeper) to the satisfaction of the referee. The goalkeeper's uniform must be different from all other players on the field and the referee. If a player forgets his uniform a similar color jersey to his team may be allowed if permitted by the referee. A player may not wear or use any equipment that is dangerous to himself or another player. The referee's decision (or coach) decision is conclusive. No hard casts will be permitted without written parental and medical consent, issued to the coach and a board member. The referee may withdraw approval for a player to participate while wearing protective equipment if the referee finds the protective equipment is being used in a way that endangers the safety of any players. No jewelry is permitted, even if taped; however, exceptions can be made for woven friendship bracelet type jewelry, religious and allergy medals can be taped to the body. Shin guards covered by socks are mandatory in all games and practices.

## **Cleanliness**

Pick up all trash around field area. Coaches are responsible for making sure fields are picked up of trash, portable goals are taken down, and all equipment is removed at the end of each game. Coaches may appoint a parent or volunteer to assist with these tasks.

## **Start times**

Teams are expected to arrive early enough to start the game at the scheduled time. Games will be delayed no more than 5 minutes for delinquent players or coaches. If players arrive late, they can enter the game once given permission from the referee.

## **Conduct**

Respect and always follow the conduct codes. Remember that foul language and unsportsmanlike behavior is unacceptable. Respect the Referees decisions'/calls. ## Covid-19 Considerations

The league will follow all applicable Covid-19 protocols and orders per the State of Oregon. Details are contained in our Covid-19 Return to Play plan. Pertinent details are included below.

- 1) Masks will be worn at all times by everyone in attendance including players, coaches, and spectators.
- 2) High fives, handshakes, fist bumps, hugs, and all other contact between players, coaches, etc. is not allowed.
- 3) The number of people in attendance will not exceed the Governor's orders. This includes, coaches, players, officials, and club administrators. Spectators will not be allowed if they will cause the total number of people present to exceed the allowable attendance. If spectators are allowed the number of spectators per player will be limited.

These numbers are:

- Extreme – 50 people
- High – 75 people
- Moderate – 150 people

- 4) Balls will be sanitized every 10-15 minutes at practices and at the end of each half of games.
- 5) Players, coaches, and officials will use hand sanitizer before and after each game and practice.
- 6) Temperatures will be checked and a health screening will be conducted upon arrival for all persons in attendance.
