

## Little League Pitcher Rules

Age	Pitches Per Day Limit
12	85
11	85
10	75
9	75
8	50
7	50

# of Pitches	Days Rest Required
66 or More	4
51-65	3
36-50	2
21-35	1
1-20	0

Example: A pitcher throws 49 pitches on Monday - he/she is eligible to pitch again on Thursday

\* If a pitcher reaches the per day limit or day(s) rest threshold while facing a batter, the pitcher may continue to pitch to the current batter until one of the following has occurred:

1. The batter reaches base
2. The batter is out
3. The 3rd out of the inning is made

\* The pitcher will only be required to observe the calendar day(s) of rest for the threshold he/she reached during the at bat, provided the pitcher is removed before delivering a pitch to another batter. For example if a 10 year old pitcher starts a batter at 34 pitches and finishes the batter at 38 pitches, as long as he/she does not throw a pitch to another batter - his/her threshold will be 35 pitches and 1 day of rest required.

\* A pitcher that delivers 41 or more pitches in a game cannot play the position of catcher for the remainder of the day.

\* A pitcher who has played the position of catcher for 4 or more innings is not eligible to pitch for the remainder of the day. Receiving one pitch, constitutes one inning

\* A pitcher once removed from the mound, cannot return as a pitcher

\* Reminder - Pitcher rules are by AGE - not by DIVISION - know how old your pitchers are.
