On behalf of the youth members of the association, I would like to thank each and every one of you who donate your time to promote, foster and perpetuate the game of soccer in the state of Missouri. Without the support of coaches, parents, family members, referees, fans and volunteers, these youth players would not be able to enjoy this great game.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to the family of Robyn Brainerd Gross who passed away suddenly on September 7, 2018. Robyn was a tireless volunteer on the Missouri Youth Soccer Association board of directors as well as helping out wherever she was needed for the Sporting St Louis Club and in the greater St Louis area.

Booneville Soccer Association:

Boonville Soccer Academy has had a pretty exciting year so far. The state-of-the-art turf fields at Missouri Soccer Park, built by the City of Boonville, opened this fall. We were able to move our practices and our small-sided league, Mid Missouri Micro, to the park and we had a record number of teams (and games) for the fall league. We heard nothing but good things about the complex and we are so privileged to have such wonderful fields in our community.

Our teams all competed in the M3, from the youngest U9 players just starting out, all the way up to the high school girls, many of whom will graduate this year. The players capped off the season by competing in Show Me State 3v3 and practiced for that in a snowstorm!

We are looking forward to our 7th annual futsal tournament, Ravens Futsal Melee VII, at the end of February. And we have something new and different in the works for this summer!

2018 was a great year – we hosted our traditional programs:

We were awarded a \$1000 Target grant based off of a proposal for a scholarship program – we have partnered with children and family services to provide this for children in the local foster care program.

We are working with our local parks department to install playground equipment at the soccer fields. Currently ISO kind donations for concrete work!

In 2018 we offered a program like “Discover Soccer” with the guidance of MYSA we piloted it over the summer and partnered with the Boys and Girls Club- we had 100 registrations for a 3 day camp we provided free of charge- every child received a shirt, a soccer ball and some small giveaways – but most importantly had a great experience.

We will continue to improve programs in our community for Soccer at all levels with a mission of community impact!

Moberly Area Soccer Association

We had a great year at MASA in 2018, our programs have been growing in the last couple of years. Our programs range from U4-U15 in the rec league and U8-U15 in our competitive program. Our Spring Rec league had a total of 384 kids signed up and the Fall Rec league had a total of

256. Our Competitive teams have approximately 65 kids that play year-round. We have seen great improvements in the fall with our Storm program. We had 8 teams compete in the Boonville M3 league with 7 of those teams finishing in the top 3. We finished our season with the SMSG 3v3 with a couple teams walking away with the GOLD.

United Capital City

United Capital City Soccer Club has spent the year developing relationships within the community to further our exposure to the City of Jefferson. We have embarked to improve relationships with the YMCA and also build new relationships with Lincoln University and the Jefferson City Parks and Recreation. Our Academy is built around our relationship with the Jefferson City YMCA, Lincoln University is allowing us to use their turf Football Field for Training and the Jefferson City Parks and Recreation is providing the LINC as a destination for our 1st annual Jefferson City Futsal SuperCup this January.

Our club has grown from about 170 players from previous year to 235 players. We can provide players with scholarships. Currently, we have 8 full scholarship players and 2 half scholarship players. It's a very exciting time to be a part of United Capital City Soccer Club.

Concerns

The referee shortage has continued to grow in our district. Our leagues are growing with way more teams than in past years (SLYSA Spring League 1,060 teams) and we still have problems with the actions of parents and sometimes grandparents during games. We continue to talk about the referee abuse issue, and we are not getting the cooperation that we need from some clubs to help police this and turn things around.

Several clubs actively participate in community service throughout our district. Our youth are enjoying themselves on the pitch because coaches are making it fun for them. Program Reports



Olympic Development Program 2017/18 Report

Our Olympic Development Program saw great growth this year. Participation was up 12% over last year, with 453 participants. Our efforts to spend more time out of the St. Louis Market promoting the ODP had a lot to do with the increased participation. We did our first ever ODP Summer Camp in Kansas City and received great reviews from parents. They were thrilled to see us in their market and we anticipate that camp growing for the upcoming summer. I reached out to the Missouri High School Soccer Association, as well as over 75 clubs across the state, in an effort to promote and educate coaches about the ODP. I have a strong belief that we must continue to foster relationships & partnerships with our clubs if we are going to maximize the opportunities for our players.

We are excited about our new partnership with the Missouri Soccer Park (Booneville, Missouri). This facility is made up of 7 new FIFA-approved turf fields. Having access to this centrally-located facility has also help attract more players from around the state.

Our coaching staff has also grown in size this year. We have added several new coaches, including 4 from the Kansas City Market. In the process of adding new coaches, the diversity of “where” our ODP coaches come from has expanded. We work very hard to be inclusive when adding highly qualified coaches that can impact the player development of the kids we serve in the ODP. Our coaching staff now includes:

- Midwest Region Staff (4)
- Midwest Region 2004 Head Girls Coach (1)
- United States Soccer Federation National Scout (1)
- Collegiate Coaches (8)
- United States Soccer Federation Coaching Education Instructors (3)
- USSF/USC Licensed (All)

We continue to offer specialized staffing for our goalkeepers. These goalkeeper coaches are involved in all training as we are committed to the development of all positional players.

This year we had 12 players named to the Midwest Regional Teams, more than ever before. This year these players will participate in competitions at the IMG Academy in Florida, Boca Raton, Florida, Costa Rica and Scotland. In addition to the aforementioned, we had one of our 2001 boys get invited to a week of training with DC United from the MLS, with the possibility of joining their “residential program.”

During the 2018-2019 ODP Cycle, we will participate in Sub-Regional and Inter-Regional events in Kansas City, Memphis and Cincinnati. These events will give our players exposure to Midwest Regional ODP Staff, US Soccer Staff and Scouts and college coaches. These opportunities will continue open doors for our soccer players as they continue to grow, develop and maximize their potential.

We experienced many positive trends in our Olympic Development Program this year and we look forward to continued growth and success!

Missouri State Cup & Presidents Cup Reports

While most of our programming and daily focus is around developing players at all levels, the one exception to this is the Missouri State Cup. Each year Missouri Youth Soccer holds the Missouri State Cup competition as part of the US Youth Soccer National Championship Series. The sole purpose of this event is to identify the best teams in our state to represent us at the Regional and National level. This season, we had a record twenty (20) teams qualify for the Midwest Regional Championships in Indiana, with seven (7) qualifying for the semifinals, two (2) teams taking home the Regional title.

USYS National League (Midwest Conference)

The US Youth Soccer National League Midwest Conference is one of 13 Conferences under the US Youth Soccer National Leagues Program in the Multi-State Tier. The Midwest Conference consists of teams primarily from Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, Missouri, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota and Minnesota. The top teams in the Conference will earn advancement to the US Youth Soccer Regional Championships, part of the US Youth Soccer National Championship Series, as well as a chance to earn a coveted spot in the National Tier of the Leagues Program, the US Youth Soccer National League.

The USYS National League – Midwest Conference (formerly MRL) features three tiers — Premier I, Premier II and First Divisions — to ensure the highest level of meaningful competition among the Midwest. The league provides an opportunity for the most competitive teams in the Midwest to play each other on a scheduled basis while also competing for placement in the prestigious US Youth Soccer Regional Championships, as well as automatic qualification into the highly-competitive US Youth Soccer National League.

Missouri continually sets records in terms of both overall participation and team placement with over 100 teams competing in the National League – Midwest Conference and teams from all ages competing in the Premier 1 and Premier 2 divisions regularly. As of this report, there are over 120 Missouri teams registered for National League in the 2018/19 season. Additionally, Missouri annually places teams into the top league in the United States...the US Youth National League.

Director of Coaching/Recreational Report

In an effort to meet the needs of our members, we are proud to be working with both the United States Soccer Federation and the United Soccer Coaches when it comes to coaching education. We recognized that our coaches across the state come with a variety of backgrounds and soccer experiences and we believe the the best way to meet their needs is to provide multiple pathways for them to grow as coaches.

We continue to support the United States Soccer Federation Educational Model when it comes to coaching education. We have increased our number USSF Certified Instructors to three, with the plans to add three more in 2019. The increase of instructors, will allow us to meet the needs of coaches that have the desire to use the USSF coaching education pathway. We will continue to offer In-Person Grassroots Course and the National D Courses.

In addition to working with the USSF, we are very excited about our plans to partner with the United Soccer Coaches. With this partnership we will be able to offer our membership another coaching education pathway.

Throughout the past year I have delivered our Missouri Youth Certificate Course to over 500 coaches across the state. This year we are working on new curriculum so that we can offer specialized courses to our coaches.

TOPSoccer Report

Currently, there are two (2) TOPSoccer program in the state of Missouri. SPENSA in St Louis, which is administrated by Kevin Byrne and his staff of volunteers and also Amanda Blackburn with Paul Klover soccer has a program in Sedalia. Thank you both for your dedication and hard work to make this happen!

So, what is TOPSoccer?

US Youth Soccer TOPSoccer (The Outreach Program for Soccer) is a community-based training and team placement program for young athletes with disabilities, organized by youth soccer association volunteers. The program is designed to bring the opportunity of learning and playing soccer to any boy or girl, who has a mental or physical disability. Our goal is to enable the thousands of young athletes with disabilities to become valued and successful members of the US Youth Soccer family. How do I participate? Contact your local US Youth Soccer State Association office to find out more about getting involved with a local US Youth Soccer TOPSoccer program.

Why do we need a TOPSoccer Program?

TOPSoccer was formed to perpetuate the US Youth Soccer mission statement which is, in part, "to foster the physical, mental and emotional growth and development of America's youth through the sport of soccer at all levels of age and competition." There are thousands of children with disabilities who need, and can be provided with, the opportunity to play soccer through the TOPSoccer program.

Risk Management Report

The risk management activities for Missouri Youth Soccer Association (MYSA) have continued to increase in importance with the SafeSport federal legislation that was signed into law. With the adoption of the Affinity player registration software we upgraded our first level risk management (background checks) which are now processed through JD Palatine. These checks now include a county and state database check which is an additional layer of verification from the previous software. In keeping with the information relayed to our membership at the 2017 AGM, these checks shall now be done on an annual basis rather than bi-annual as the previous system ran.

Since the beginning of the current background checks period (July 2018), we have processed over 5,000 background checks. Each submission is reviewed and measured against the same set of standards and if needed are referred to the Risk Management Committee for further determination.

The background check is a required element for every adult that comes in contact or has access to information about our youth players. In addition to the on-going background checks, US Youth Soccer has recently released an updated Code of Conduct for all its membership which was adopted within the State of Missouri. The federal SafeSport regulations now require abuse training for all those persons involved in a sport that is governed by an NGO (National Governing Organization), our NGO is the US Soccer Federation and we are now required to have education, reporting and identification requirements that must be in place no later than September 2019.
