Thank you for registering to become a part of the Sykesville Baseball Organization. We are one of many great youth sports programs in the Freedom area and are proud to offer baseball to boys and girls from Sykesville, Eldersburg, and all surrounding areas. Sykesville Baseball offers recreation leagues and travel baseball teams for children ages 4 to 22 years old. Fees must be paid at the time of registration.

Please note that all registrations will be done online. Online registration started on 11/1/2019 and ended on 2/22/2020. A \$10.00 late fee is assessed for late registrations beginning on 2/2/2020. Be advised that you are not guaranteed a spot in the program when registering after 2/22/2020, however, we do our absolute best to accommodate everyone that registers. Your child may be placed on a waitlist if their age group is full when registering late. Therefore, we encourage you to register as early as possible.

Running a youth program of our size takes a lot of hard work year-round. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank our Board members, coaches, snack bar volunteers, sponsors, and other volunteers that all contribute to making Sykesville Baseball a successful program. I'd also like to thank the Freedom Area Recreation Council for their support. Without this commitment, our success would not be possible.

POSITIVE COACHING – We will train and encourage our coaches to make an extra effort to understand and offer positive help to our players, rather than negative criticism.

BALANCED TEAMS – We make our best effort to ensure our teams are as evenly balanced as possible...because it is more fun when teams of equal ability play.

EVERYONE PLAYS – Our major goal is to provide a league where every child plays baseball... so, we mandate that every player on every team must play at least four innings of every six-inning game.

OPEN REGISTRATION – The foundation of the league is to allow the youth of our community to participate in sports. Our program is open to all children between 4 and 22 years old who want to register and play baseball.

RECREATION PROGRAM POLICY

AGE: The league is open to all children between 4 and 18 years old who want to register and play baseball. The division in which your child plays is determined by his/her age on July 31. The birthday cutoff date for 4-year old players is December 31st.

CALENDAR: The program guide has a calendar of events for the league. Parents are needed to assist us in operating the program.

EQUIPMENT: All divisions - The league will provide fields and equipment (bases, bats, balls, catchers safety equipment, and batting helmets).

UNIFORMS: All divisions - Will receive hats, tee shirts, pants & socks which the players may keep.

PRACTICE: The managers will contact the players on their team by the 2nd week of March to discuss practice nights and fields.

REFUND SCHEDULE:

All requests for registration refunds must be addressed in writing to the league president. Refunds will then be sent within two weeks from receipt of the request. A \$10.00 per child administrative fee is non-refundable on all registrations. The balance will be refunded if requested by Opening Day and the uniform is returned by Opening Day. REGISTRATION PROCESS:

Formal registration will take place from November 1 - January 31 at <https://www.sykesvillebaseball.com>. We will try to accommodate late registrations; we cannot guarantee a place on a team after official registration is held. An additional \$10.00 will be assessed for late registration as of February 1, 2020.

WAITING LIST: Late registration players will be placed on a waiting list and assigned to a team on an availability basis. A full refund will be applied if the child cannot be placed on a team.

WEATHER CANCELLATION:

All weather-related cancellations will be made by the Board Member in charge of the Clubhouse on the day of the game. The cancellation information will be emailed to all families and posted to the social media sites as early as possible.

UMPIRE PROGRAM



We at Sykesville Baseball are extremely proud of our Umpire program which began over 30 years ago. During February and March each year, Sykesville Baseball conducts an Umpire Training class covering rules, positioning, and mechanics. Each umpire candidate in the class is given a package containing the local Sykesville Baseball rules, National Federation High School rules, and various classroom handouts used in conjunction with the lectures provided during the 7-week class. The training class concludes with a final examination that the candidates must pass before being awarded

the Sykesville Baseball Umpire patch for their shirts, and a field trip to a Frederick Keys game to observe and meet a professional umpiring crew.

Umpires are becoming a rare commodity and the Baseball program would not be able to succeed without this training program. There is a \$25 registration fee that covers the cost of rule books, handouts and umpire hats, bags, indicators, and brushes. New umpires will also be required to purchase a uniform shirt at a cost of \$25.

The 2021 class will be held on Online Sunday afternoons, from 1:00 to 3:00 beginning February 7. Those interested in joining the program should register online at www.sykesvillebaseball.com or register at the first class on February 7th.

The program is open to 12-year old's through adults. Umpires must be 12 years old as of July 1st of playing season.

CODE OF CONDUCT

PARENT'S CODE

- * Do not force an unwilling child to participate in sports.
- * Teach your child to play by the rules
- * Help your child work toward skill improvement and good sportsmanship in every game.
- * DO NOT ridicule or yell at your child or any child for making a mistake or for losing a game.
- * Applaud good plays by your team and by members of the opposing team.

- * Recognize the value and importance of volunteer coaches, and officials. Without them, there would be no baseball league.

MANAGER'S CODE

- * Ensure that your player's baseball experience is one of fun and enjoyment. Players should never be yelled at or ridiculed for making a mistake or losing a game.
- * Set a good example and be generous with your praise. Children need a coach they can respect.
- * Keep informed about sound coaching principles and the growth and development principles of children.
- * Practice the "Positive Coaching" and "Everybody Plays" philosophies of the Sykesville Baseball Organization.
- * Be reasonable in your demands on the young player's time, energy, enthusiasm, and performance on the field.
- * Enlist the support of your team's parents in your efforts to instill the proper values and attitudes in the players.

PLAYER'S CODE

- * Play for the fun of it, not just to please your parents or coach.
- * Play by the rules.
- * Be a good sport by cheering all good plays, whether it is your team's or the opponents.
- * Cooperate with your coaches, teammates, opponents, and the umpire.

- * Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Control your temper and resist the temptation to retaliate against another player.
- * Remember the goals of the game are to have fun, improve your skills, and feel good.

UMPIRE'S CODE

- * Always remember the game is for the players. Player safety and fair play come first.

- * Study and learn the Rules of the Game and understand the "spirit" of the Rules.

- * Stay calm when confronted with emotional reactions from players, coaches, and parents.
- * Honor accepted game assignments. In case of an emergency or conflict, find a replacement.
- * Support good sportsmanship with kind words to players, coaches, and parents of both teams when deserved.
- * Always be fair and impartial, avoiding conflicts of interest. Decisions based upon personal bias are dishonest and unacceptable.

- * Wear the proper equipment provided by the league. Keep it in good condition.
