



## Little League Baseball Canada

**Position:** Umpire Evaluator

**Description:** The Umpire Evaluator is appointed by the National Umpire Coordinator. There is a separate Umpire Evaluator appointed to each Regional Baseball Championship.

**Reporting:** The Umpire Evaluator reports to the National Umpire Coordinator

---

The Umpire Evaluator must possess character, good judgment, the ability to get along with youngsters as well as adults, and the desire to do the job well. Umpire Evaluators will have experience umpiring at the Regional level in Canada. Experience umpiring at any level of the Little League World Series is considered an asset. The Umpire Evaluator will have a strong knowledge of the rules and be able to interpret them, in addition they will have an advanced understanding of 2, 3, and 4-man umpire systems and mechanics.

The Umpire Evaluator is responsible for:

- Representing Little League Canada with the purpose of providing umpire development at Regional level tournaments;
- Attend required training sessions as indicated by Little League Canada;
- Work with local officials, including but not limited to Tournament Director, Tournament Umpire in Chief & Tournament Umpires to facilitate umpire development opportunities;
- Attend all games at assigned championship and lead post game debriefing sessions with umpires to facilitate learning and development as well as consistency in umpire practices across Little League Canada Regional Championships;
- Ensure that Little League Canada Umpire Uniform Standard is adhered to;
- Work with Tournament Director and Tournament Umpire in Chief to offer recommendations for playoff game umpire assignments;
- In coordination with Tournament Director and Tournament Umpire in Chief develop umpire recommendations for World Series assignments the following season. Recommendations for World Series assignments are to be based on umpire evaluations. World Series recommendations are submitted to the National Umpire committee for further review and submission to the Regional Director;
- Provide tournament umpires with post-tournament evaluation in writing, review this evaluation in person during a private meeting;
- Submit within 30 days of the completion of the assigned Regional tournament a report to the National Umpire Committee detailing the umpire evaluations and any items of note that occurred over the duration of the tournament.
