## **ELIGIBILITY**

The following are required to become a DYA Youth Official:

Grades: 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade

Residency: Must be a City of Dublin resident or Dublin City School District resident

Pass test: New applicants must pass a basketball rules test Sign-up: New applicants sign up through the DYA website

Returning officials: Automatically eligible to referee during future seasons

### REFEREE QUALIFICATION TEST

Each new applicant must pass a written basketball rules test to become a DYA Youth Official. The test is administered in the first half of November. Study material (DYA Basketball Rule Book & Basketball Officials Training Information) is available on DYA's website under the Officials tab. Applicants must score at least 75% to pass the test. A retake may be offered based on the need for officials.

Passing the DYA Youth Officials Rules Test is required. (Study the available material, the test is not easy!)

### **CLINICS & SCRIMMAGES**

Clinics and scrimmages provide on-court training to help officials be successful. All training is facilitated by licensed Ohio High School Athletic Association officials. Additional information regarding clinics will be emailed to all registered applicants.

# **UNIFORM PURCHASE**

Referee uniform shirts (adult sizes S, M, L, XL) will be available for purchase at the on-court training and scrimmages for \$20. Rookie officials will be provided a whistle.

# **CONCUSSION CERTIFICATION**

Ohio Law requires ALL officials (even youth officials) to be certified in concussion recognition. Please note that there is no liability to the official for failing to recognize a concussion, but they still must be certified. There's a short online course and "test" that can be taken for free - it takes about 30 minutes, which can be found at <a href="https://nfhslearn.com/courses/concussion-in-sports-2">https://nfhslearn.com/courses/concussion-in-sports-2</a>.

### **GAME SCHEDULING**

It is the goal of the program that all youth officials work at least 15 games each year, which is necessary for promotion to the next classification level. Officials will work 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade boys and 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade girls recreational league games and can expect to be scheduled to work 20 to 30 games per season. Regular season games begin in December and the tournament concludes in early March. Games are played on Saturday mornings and afternoons at elementary and middle school gymnasiums in the Dublin City School District.

- ✓ Officials submit a work availability sheet at the beginning of the season.
- ✓ Game schedules are e-mailed to officials and parents on a weekly basis.
- ✓ Officials (or their parents) must keep the Officials Commissioner aware of unavailable dates/times
- ✓ If unavailable to work their scheduled games, officials are required to find a substitute.

#### **OFFICIALS CLASSIFICATIONS**

- Class 1: 1st Year officials and 2nd Year officials with at fewer than 15 games of experience
- Class 2: 2<sup>nd</sup> Year officials with 15+ games of experience and 3<sup>rd</sup> Year officials with <30 games of experience
- Class 3: 3<sup>rd</sup> Year officials with 30+ games of experience
- Senior: 4<sup>th</sup> Year or above (note: Class 3 officials may substitute for Senior Officials)

## **OFFICIALS PAY**

**Game Pay** (cash paid at game time on the court):

- Senior Officials: \$12 per game
  - o Senior Officials work on the court the entire game.
- Junior Officials: \$8 per game
  - Junior Officials work on the court for one half and operate the scoreboard for the other half.

#### **Bonus Pay** (paid at the end of the season):

- Class 2 & Class 3 Officials: \$25 bonus for working 20+ games with zero no-shows
- Senior Officials: \$50 bonus for working 25+ games with zero no-shows OR \$25 bonus for working 20 to 24 games with zero no-shows
