

Rumford Little League Division Information

The path for most children starts in Tee-Ball, typically after one season of Tee-ball the child will move up to Farm. Farm is where your child will continue to build on the skills and concepts introduced in Tee-ball. After two years of Farm, many children are ready to try-out to move up to the Minors. Players usually spend two to three years in Minors before moving up to Majors.

Here is some more information on the Minors and Majors divisions:

- **Minors:** The Minors Division is the next step from Farm. It is a player pitch only league with walks, strike-outs, wins/losses and playoffs at the end of the season. The season is longer than Farm and you can expect at least 2 games/week and a practice. The division is made up primarily of Little League ages 8 to 10, with some 11's that are not ready for Majors
- **Majors:** The Majors Division is a competitive division in the 10 to 12-year-old age bracket of Little League. It is made up primarily of Little League ages 11 and 12 and a few advanced 10's.

Division	Baseball
Tee-ball	Baseball age 4-6 <i>Age 7 if never played before</i>
Farm (Machine/Coach Pitch-baseball)	Baseball ages 6 to 8 <i>Age 9 if never played, or not ready for Minors</i>
Minors	Baseball ages 8 to 10 <i>Exceptions : Age 11 if not ready for Majors, 2 years of play in Minors recommended</i>
Majors	Baseball ages 11 and 12 <i>Exceptions: Age 10 Minors manager recommendation only</i>
Juniors	Primary baseball age: 13 to 14
Seniors	Primary baseball age: 14 to 16

Tryouts: Only players registering for a new division (moving up to either Minors or Majors) must attend tryouts to be drafted on a team.

- If the player is registering for the same division then they do not need to tryout.
