ROSTER SIZES AND GAME MINIMUMS

- U10 13 players (5 min) 7 v 7 30 min halves
- U11 15 players (6 min) 9 v 9 30 min halves
- U12 15 players (6 min) 9 v 9 30 min halves
- U13 18 players (7 min) 11 v 11 35 min halves
- U14 18 players (7 min) 11 v 11 35 min halves
- U15 18 players (7 min) 11 v 11 40 min halves
- U16 18 players (7 min) 11 v 11 40 min halves
- HS/U17-U19 21 players (7 min) 11 v 11 40 min halves

EACH TEAM must designate one adult (other than coach) prior to the start of each game to serve as Team Sportsmanship Liaison (TSL). The TSL will accompany the captain of team to meet with the referee prior to the match. The match MAY NOT BE STARTED until both teams have identified their TSL's. The TSL will assist the coach with spectator behavior on their team sideline during the game Teams and their spectators must occupy opposite sides of the field. Home team chooses its side.

SUBSTITUTIONS

May be made with the consent of the referee at the following times:

- prior to a throw-in by either team only when team in possession chooses to substitute
- prior to a kick-off
- prior to a goal kick by either team
- prior to a corner kick by either team (11 v 11, only when team in possession chooses to substitute)
- upon issuance of a yellow card (only players involved may be substituted. If so, the opposing team may substitute a like number)
- on an injury (only players involved may be substituted: if so, opposing team may substitute a like number)

YELLOW CARDS

Player must sit out at least 5 minutes. Substitution allowed.

RED CARDS

Receipt of a red card by a player, coach or spectator results in immediate ejection from the field of play and a minimum one-game suspension from the next league game, with no appeal. A coach or spectator receiving a red card must leave the field immediately and move at least to the parking lot. He or she may not return to the field at the end of the game, or be on the sidelines at the following game. The jurisdiction of the referee begins upon his arrival at the parking area and continues until he leaves the parking area. If a red card is issued, the offending person is prohibited from attending the team's next game. It is recommended, but not required, that referees show cards to coaches and spectators who are formally warned or expelled from the field.

EQUIPMENT

- Metal cleats are banned in all MSI programs.
- Most eye glasses have been deemed safe for wear during games by MD State Referee Administrator. Goggles with strap are acceptable but not mandatory.
- No jewelry is to be worn, including pierced earrings.
- Casts are allowed if protected, but ultimately up to the referee's discretion for safety.
