



CWJRD Covid-19 Operation Plan

On August 20, 2020, the ODH Order passed mandates that all sports organizers must provide their local health department an operating plan to allow sport activities to safely resume. The following standards will be enforced at all CWJRD sponsored activities.

- All players, coaches, volunteers, spectators, and officials must conduct daily health checks. If anyone is experiencing any signs of illness or symptoms, they must stay home.
- All coaches, volunteers, spectators, and officials must wear face coverings at all times. Players must wear face coverings when not actively participating in their sport.

- Coaches must:
 - Promote good hygiene
 - Designate a parent or volunteer to help participants maintain proper social distancing
 - Participate in the Covid-19 education program
 - Educate their players on how to prevent the spread of Covid-19

- Equipment and personal items must be separated.
- If equipment is shared, it is to be sanitized after each use.
- There is to be no sharing of food, drink, facial coverings, clothing, blankets, or towels.
- Players, coaches, officials, volunteers, or any other individual that had close contact (within six feet of an infected person for more than fifteen minutes) must self-quarantine for 14 days.
 - Any player, coach, official, spectator, or volunteer become ill or develop symptoms, they must quarantine and seek medical care.
 - They will contact local health department about any suspected Covid-19 cases.
 - Any person presenting symptoms or illness should seek Covid-19 testing as soon as possible
- Six feet of social distancing must be maintained by coaches, players, volunteers, spectators, and officials, except when necessary in the course of play.
- There will be no congregating before or after the games.
- There will be no use of CWLSD playground equipment during games/practice.
- Groups of no more than 4 people, unless they are in the same household.
- At risk persons are urged to stay home.
- Time must be allotted for teams to enter and exit the facilities without crossing paths, and allowing for sanitizing of high touch areas and equipment
- Groups must be separated by six feet.
- Misty Swearingen, CWJRD Manager of Programming and Communication, will be the CWJRD Compliance Officer.
- All CWJRD Board Members will have the authority to enforce the Operation Plan:

ANYONE WHO IS NOT COMPLIANT WILL BE POLITELY ASKED TO COMPLY. IF COMPLIANCE DOES NOT OCCUR, YOU WILL BE ASKED TO REMOVE YOURSELF FROM THE FIELD/FACILITY.
