Howard County native Rob Ryerson attended Oakland Mills High School in Columbia, where he was part of a Maryland State Championship team in 1981 and that year was also named the Howard County "Player of the Year". Rob then went on to be a two-time All-American at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas where he still holds the school record for most goals scored in a career at 67. Shortly after his senior year, he had his #10 retired.

After college, Rob played Professional soccer over 9 seasons with various teams to include the local professional clubs the Baltimore Blast, Maryland Bays and Washington Warthogs. He also went on to play with the US National Team scoring the only goal in a 1-0 win over Costa Rica on June 14th, 1988.

After playing professionally, Rob has been equally successful coaching at all levels in the game to include two years at DeMatha High School, 18 years collegiately at UMBC, UNLV and Mount St. Mary's, and in the Professional ranks as the Head Coach at the Baton Rouge Bombers professional indoor team. As a USSF "A" Licensed coach, Rob is also an instructor for the Maryland State Soccer Association and is currently a US Soccer Scout identifying the most talented players in the country. He also has most recently served as an Assistant Coach for the U18 and U16 US Boys National Teams. Ryerson has been selected to the "Oakland Mills - Hall of Fame", the "UNLV Athletic - Hall of Fame" in 1998 and in 2006 he was inducted into the "Maryland Soccer Hall of Fame."
