Conduct Guidelines and Behavior Expectations

Managers and Coaches are expected to:

Provide leadership and organization.

Develop a good rapport with players and their parents/guardians.

Observe all league policies and rules.

Set an example of high moral character, behavior, and leadership while adhering to strong ethical and integrity standards.

Display respect to players, parents/guardians, officials, spectators, managers and coaches.

Abide by and teach the rules and skills of baseball in letter and in spirit.

Display modesty in victory and graciousness in defeat.

Instruct participants and spectators in proper sportsmanship.

Be no party to the use of profanity, inappropriate subject matter, physical threats or intimidation, or any unsportsmanlike conduct.

Players are expected to:

Accept and understand that they are representing their team, league, and local community in their participation in Kernersville Little League.

Live up to the standards of sportsmanship established by the league and coaching staff.

Learn the rules of the game and strive to develop baseball skills.

Wish opponents good luck prior to games and congratulate them or thank them for a good game following a victory or loss.

Never challenge the authority of any umpire, coach or manager.

Always strive to give their very best regardless of the score.

Be no party to the use of profanity, inappropriate subject matter, physical threats or intimidation, or any unsportsmanlike conduct.

Parents and Spectators are expected to:

Remember that baseball is a learning experience, these are children playing, and that mistakes will be made.

Be no party to the use of profanity, inappropriate subject matter, physical threats or intimidation, or any unsportsmanlike conduct.

Provide encouragement. Recognize and show appreciation of outstanding effort by either team.

Be a positive and supportive role model through your own actions.

Never challenge the authority of any umpire, coach or manager.

Properly supervise non-participating children at all times.

Any manager, coach, parent/guardian, or spectator ejected from a game by an umpire or League Official shall immediately leave the complex. If the ejected party has a child participating, he/she shall remain without further disruption at their vehicle until their child finishes play. Any player ejected must leave the field and complex with their parent/guardian. If no parent is present, the player must go to the concession stand to await the arrival of a parent/guardian. Anyone ejected must leave for the day, and will not be permitted to enter the complex during the next scheduled game. Any additional offense will result in suspension for the remainder of the season, including tournament and All-Stars.
