

GUEST PLAYER RULES – Fall 2018

Updated: 6/25/18

Effective Fall 2018, guest players are allowed to play in the SCSA league. The following procedures are in place to add guest players for tournaments or SCSA league. Guest players are subject to same rules as primary and secondary players and should not be used to gain a competitive advantage or for recruitment purposes. Priority should be given to rostered players over guest players. Guest play is designed for situations of true hardship.

1. Maximum of three (3) guest players allowed per competitive team per game for U9 to U19 teams.
 - No guest players allowed for recreational teams (U5-U8).
 - Teams may not exceed maximum roster allowed on game day by adding guest players.
 - Unique number and matching team player jersey is required for the guest.
 - Players are limited to no more than two (2) guest plays for a specific team within a season. After 2 games with same team, they would need to be added to official roster to play 3rd game.
 - Multiple roster rules apply to all guest players.
 - Guest players may not play in divisions lower than division currently rostered. Example: U14D1 player may not guest play with a U14 D2 or lower team. Able to guest play up for older divisions.
 - Players who play on multiple teams are required to get permission to guest play from both the Primary head coach and Secondary head coach if not the same person. Assistant coaches are not authorized to grant the permission.
 - Guest players may not guest for a second team in the same division.
2. Fees for Guest players may vary based on current player's registration.
 - No fee assessed – player is currently registered with SCSA as a player for another SCSA competitive team. Player uses current player card with primary team.
 - \$13 per guest player – fee is assessed to new player if not currently on SCSA or KSYSA team. Player will be required to register with the SCSA At-Large team if not being rostered to another team to receive player card. See Step #5 for new guest player registration.
 - Fees are due and payable to SCSA office before the game date.
3. Documentation required to have a guest player on game day.
 - If currently rostered to a competitive SCSA team:
 - Guest player permit filed at KSYSA website prior to game day. See Step #4.
 - Guest player permit is required to be given to center referee at check-in on game day.
 - Guest player should have their primary player card submitted at check-in with the team player cards.
 - Failure to submit guest player form or primary player card at game time may make player ineligible and result in forfeit of the game.
 - Guest player first and last name must be recorded clearly on the line-up card with a “G” in front of the player's name next to the guest player's number.
 - If not currently rostered to a KSYSA team – required to add as an SCSA At-Large player, see Step #5 for process.

4. KSYSA Guest Player permit, website, www.kansasyouthsoccer.org - Admin – Travel Permit/Guest Player – Tournament Center. Create unique sign-on as will use this ongoing with KSYSA.

A. Borrowing team/Contact Information – completed for team requesting use of guest player

B. Borrowing Team Information – specific team information

C. Event Information –

Type of Event – chose Restricted Tournament, also includes Restricted League games

Event Name – SCSA league or specific tournament

Event Dates – date of league or tournament game

D. Guest Player list – able to add 1-3 guest players on same permit. Information from the guest player card from the primary team head coach.

E. Electronic Signature – mark “I agree” box and complete for authorized team official from the Borrowing Team. Confirms Borrowing coach has personally contacted the Primary (and Secondary, if required) Coach of the player(s) and received their approval to use the player.

F. Submit the guest player permit and print a copy for the league game requested. This information is retained on KSYSA website and may be reprinted at a later date.

5. Registering a guest player if not currently on SCSA team or KSYSA team. Required to add new player to SCSA At-Large team. Following items needed:

- Player membership form
- Medical release form
- Proof of birth if not previously played at SCSA – Birth certificate or passport
- Current headshot picture of player in jpeg format
- Fees of \$13 based on status within KSYSA. See step #2.

6. Borrowing team’s head coach is responsible for proper documentation to be presented BEFORE the game check-in. Failure to do so result in the player being excluded and the borrowing team subject to a forfeit. SCSA will monitor guest player activity to ensure compliance.
