

Brookwood Soccer At-A-Glance

What's Expected of a BHS Soccer Player?

- To tryout, a player must have a current physical before **December 18, 2020**. The correct form is available for download from the www.brookwoodsoccer.com or the Brookwood High School website. **Players will not be allowed to participate in tryouts or practices without an updated physical.**
- Maintain a minimum 2.00 GPA to participate, passing at least 5 of 6 classes.
- Maintain a high standard of behavior, representing BHS in a positive manner.
- Successfully compete at tryouts and be selected to play on the Varsity or Junior Varsity team.
- Attend the pre-season kick-off meeting, team building day, and stadium clean-up day.

What's A Parent To Do?

- Projected BHS Soccer Booster Club dues (Varsity - \$575, Junior Varsity \$525) to be paid at/before the pre-season kick-off meeting. Payment plans may be considered on a case-by-case basis. An additional \$50 volunteer check deposit is required and will be returned at the end of the season provided both home game duties have been fulfilled.
- Attend the pre-season kick-off meeting and stadium clean-up day.
- Be involved in your child's high school athletic experience.
 - This will include at least one scheduled Concession Stand shift as well as volunteering, plus a scheduled stadium set up (women's teams) or clean up (men's teams) on game day.
- Concession Stand duty is a responsibility shared by the parents of all players throughout the season. Typically, the men's parents are scheduled to work during the women's games, and women's parents are scheduled work during the men's games.
- Encourage players to do their best on and off the field; support the coaching staff & Booster Club.

About the Booster Club

The BHS Soccer Booster Club, Inc. is an organization run by parent volunteers working closely with the coaching staff. The Club provides the financial assistance necessary to run a quality soccer program. They provide services, facilities, and equipment that are not provided by Gwinnett County Public Schools. The schools provide the fields, stands, team transportation, and a supplement for one coach per team. The Booster Club is responsible for all other aspects of the program, including uniforms, tournaments, banquets, and some capital improvements.
