

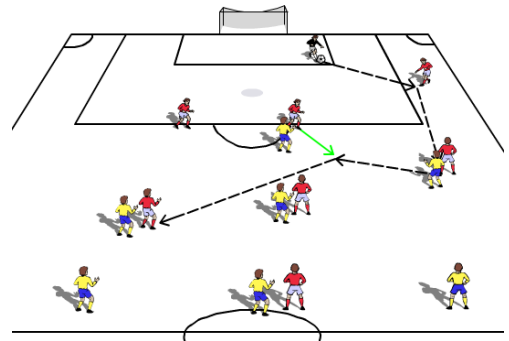
Taking Goal Kicks

Goalkeepers can use any of their team-mates to pass to at a goal kick, however, it is all dependent on players being in the right position at the right time in order to receive the ball and avoid any potential problems.

This guide has been put together as a guide for your teams (obviously add or remove players depending on the numbers you play, however, the one key point that always remains the same is that when the kick is taken, all of our players remain 'goal side' of the opposition attackers making it much easier for the goalkeeper. Any slips and the defender will be able to react to the ball before the attacker can capitalize on a loose ball.

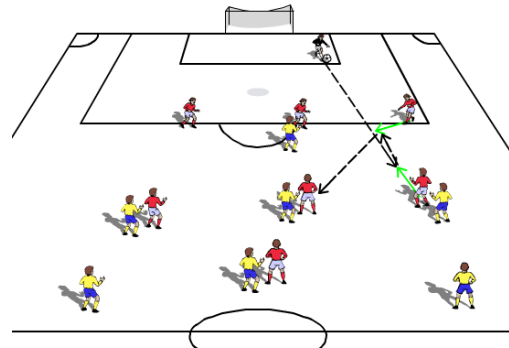
Playing Out Through the Defence

- The goalkeeper plays the ball out wide to the fullback who drops back into space
- They play it forward to the midfielder who passes inside to the central defender
- The central defender can bring the ball forward into space



Playing Out Through the Midfield

- The goalkeeper plays the ball out to one of the midfielders who drops back to lose their marker
- They play it back to the full-back in space.
- The fullback can bring the ball forward into the space in front of them or make a pass into one of the other midfielders



Playing Out Through the Attack

- The goalkeeper looks to launch an attack with a long kick high up the field for the attacker to challenge for
- The ball is flicked on by a midfielder for the attacker to run on to
